#### **Lucy Ambrosino-Marchak** ***Port Authority of New York and New Jersey***

*Lucy Ambrosino is the Manager of Outreach for the Port Commerce Department of the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey, where she has been since 1990. A member of the international freight community since 1975, Lucy has worked for major steamship lines such as CAST, Seatrain Pacific, Mitsui OSK Lines and SEALAND. Her work history also includes working for NVOCC's, a freight forwarder and, just prior to the Port Authority, for CSX Intermodal.*

*At the Port Authority, she has been responsible for managing the foreign trade zone, legislative affairs, intermodal marketing, and, in her current responsibilities, working with various port industry stakeholders such as the Corps of Engineers, the US Coast Guard, Harbor Pilots, NOAA, various maritime industry advocacy groups, and calling on importers and exporters.*

*She is the President of the Traffic Club of New York, Vice-President of Westconn Int'l Trade Assn., the Vice-Chair of the Harbor Safety, Navigation and Operations Committee of the Port of NY/NJ, and serves on the Advisory Council of Baruch College's International Trade Operations Program. Lucy has a B.S. in Journalism from New York University's School of Education and a Masters in Urban Planning from the NYU Robert Wagner School of Public Service*

**Tuesday, 12 July - The Newark Bay Tour**

Departs from Pier 16 at 6:15pm  
(at the end of Fulton Street, South Street Seaport)

*Featuring the Kill Van Kull, Bayonne Bridge and The Giant Container Ports of Newark Bay*

*This tour passes by the Red Hook Container Terminal and visits Erie Basin, home of Hughes Brothers Barges and Reinauer Tugs before crossing the harbor toward Staten Island. It then enters Kill Van Kull, the area's busiest waterway dividing Staten Island and Bayonne, passing tug yards, oil docks and marine repair facilities. It then passes under the Bayonne Bridge and visits the giant container ports of Newark Bay, Port Newark and Port Elizabeth where the world's largest container ships tie up. On the way back, we pass by Military Ocean Terminal, the 9/11 Teardrop Memorial, the Robbin's Reef Lighthouse and another container port, ending up at sunset at the Statue of Liberty for a moment before returning to Pier 16.*

*Dan Wiley is a Community Coordinator for a Congressperson in southwest Brooklyn, NY, and is an Adjunct Assistant Professor at Columbia University in the urban design studio. ## Tuesday, 26 July - The Brooklyn Tour

Departs from Pier 16 at 6:15pm  
(at the end of Fulton Street, South Street Seaport)

*Featuring Brooklyn's Maritime Heritage & Future - Brooklyn Navy Yard to Sunset Park*

*This tour goes north (actually east) on the East River to the former Brooklyn Navy Yard, passing under the Brooklyn and Manhattan Bridges. The Navy Yard has three large graving docks and an active shipyard, as well as the home port of FDNY's fireboat division. We then travel south along the Brooklyn waterfront, passing the new Brooklyn Bridge Park and the Red Hook Container Terminal, Atlantic Basin, and Erie Basin, home of Hughes Brothers Barges and Reinauer Tugs. We continue into Gowanus Bay and along the Sunset Park waterfront, home of the former large Bush Terminals. We then cross over to the Statue of Liberty at sunset for a moment before returning to Pier 16.*

## Ship Profile: Fireboat *Three Forty Three*

The New York City Fire Department Marine Unit's newest member is fireboat *Three Forty Three*. It was designed and built to replace the fireboat *John D. McKean*. It was placed into service at on 11 September 2010. The date placed into service is symbolic for *Three Forty Three* as the only water available to the World Trade Center area for days following

the terrorist attacks was provided by the FDNY's Marine Units as well as retired fireboat *John 1 Harvey*. Fireboat *Three Forty Three*'s name comes from the number of FDNY

members killed in the line of duty on 11 September 2001.

The *Three Forty Three* is the largest single purpose fireboat built to date with the highest pumping capacity of any fireboat ever built. It is the country's largest fireboat at 140-foot and weighing 500-tons with a maximum speed of 18 knots. It has the capability of pumping 50,000 gallons of water per minute - enough to fill a pool in less than 30 seconds.

How it works: A fireboat is a specialized watercraft and with pumps and nozzles designed for fighting shoreline and shipboard fires. They pump water from the river directly below the hull into the nozzles resulting in an unlimited supply of water. This can be of great assistance to shore based fires with low or no water supply as was the case on 11 September 2001 . The first fireboats were tugboats, re-fitted with firefighting pumps and hoses around the mid-19th century.

You can see fireboat *Three Forty Three* on our North River Tour - 23 August. It is located at Pier 53 at the foot of Bloomfield Street.
