Working Harbor Committee is now offering Brooklyn's Maritime Past, Present & Future Hidden Harbor Tour® featuring the birthplace of intermodal shipping and plans for the future in Sunset Park.

We will go to Newtown Creek, Brooklyn Navy Yard, Brooklyn Piers, Buttermilk Channel and Governors Island, Atlantic & Erie Basins, Gowanus Bay, South Brooklyn, Upper New York Harbor, Military Ocean Terminal, Global Marine Terminal and end up at the Statue of Liberty.

On this tour we will see container & cruise ship ports, a RR car-float terminal, tug and barge traffic mixing it up with water taxis, excursion boats, and historic vessels, Bush Terminal and Brooklyn Army Terminal and the proposed location of New York's next giant container terminal and Cross Harbor RR Tunnel.

We will learn how the working harbor really works and what's coming in the near future, why shipping is the most green way to get goods into the region, how your Toyota, TV or pair of sneakers got here, what we export, and more.

Profile: Peter Stanford - Founder of the WHC

Peter Stanford, the founder of the Working Harbor Committee, was an advertising executive before he and his wife, Norma, started the South Street Seaport Museum in 1967. He was instrumental in acquiring many of the institution's exhibits including the tall ships *Wavertree*, a four-masted barque, and *Peking*, a fully rigged ship – as well as the preservation of historic *Schermerhorn Row*, which today serves as the Museum's center. He was also instrumental in the formation of the National Maritime Historic Society, a nationwide not-for-profit dedicated to the restoration and preservation of historic ships, and serves as Editor-at-Large of its renowned publication, *Sea History*.

Peter is today retired but busy writing about the early days of the Museum's history. He currently serves as an honorary member of the Museum's Board of Trustees. And he founded the Working Harbor Committee in 2003, and served as its first Chair of the Board. 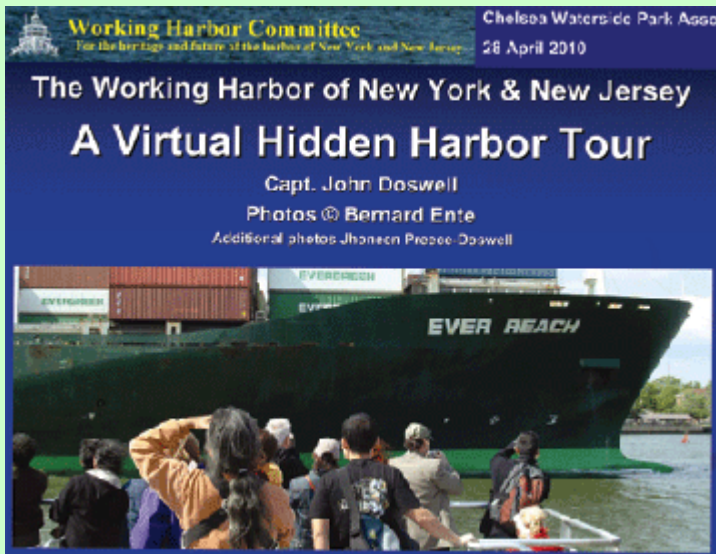
